

Hole 1 - Beavertown Gamma Ray (Tottenham Hale, London)

A great opening Beer, Beavertown's signature brew. This American pale ale is a corker. Tee this up and you will enjoy lots of juicy malts and huge tropical aromas of mango and grapefruit. Brewed in Tottenham Hale just 12,000 yards away.

Hole 2 - Beavertown Neck Oil (Tottenham Hale, London)

An easy 2nd beer, Beavertown have created this every day, all day, easy drinking, go to IPA. This beer is light, crisp and punchy, A true gem of a beer.

Hole 3 - Beavertown Lupuloid (Tottenham Hale, London)

The most notable thing about this 6.7% IPA is that it is a straight up IPA, no funny business, just malt, yeast, water and hops. Lots of hops.

Hole 4 - Redchurch Bethnal Pale Ale (Bethnal Green, London)

An inspiring blend of English malts and American hops - this is a big, juicy fruit packed pale ale.

Hole 5 - Redchurch Shoreditch Blonde (Bethnal Green, London)

A truly international combination of British lager malt, German yeast and a unique blend of American hops. This is a moreish and incredibly drinkable blonde lager.

Hole 6 - Redchurch Brick Lane Lager (Bethnal Green, London)

Cold fermented lager that combines British lager malt, American hops and true lager yeast to create a truly crisp, refreshing beer. Pale and dry with overtones of citrus fruit with huge grassy overtones.

Hole 7 - Brewdog Elvis Juice (Scotland, UK)

Uh-huh-huh, Brewdog's entry into the ongoing grapefruit beer battle, Elvis Juice is infused with loads of tart grapefruit peel. This American style IPA has intense aromas of, well grapefruit, alongside hop notes of pine.

Hole 8 - Brewdog Punk IPA (Scotland, UK)

We'll spare you the riotous/punk/apocolyptic/hide-your-kids description from the Brewdog punks. We'll just tell you that if you are a hop-head, then this is the beer for you! Notes of lychee, tropical fruits, pineapple and caramel malts

Hole 9 - FCamden Hells (Camden, London)

Hells is the lovechild of two German beer styles, Helles and Pilsner. This clean, crisp lager is one of the most refreshing tipples in London

Hole 10 - Kernel Table Beer (Bermondsey, London)

Super light IPA full of flavoured hopiness that never overpowers. This is an amazing session IPA that makes for a delightfully drinkable treat.

Hole 11 - Kernel India Porter (Bermondsey, London)

In our opinion, there are very few brewers that can compete with the IPA's and pale ales that The Kernel produces, but the export stout gets a lot less praise than it deserves. Lots of coffee and liqorice create an endlessly drinkable dark beer.

Hole 12 - Corona Extra (Mexico)

Needs very little by way of introduction. Crisp, clean and refreshing - add a wedge of lime. Probably the easiest drinking beer on the course.

Hole 13 - Kona Hanalei (Kailua-Kona, Hawaii)

This easy-driinkiing island inspired IPA is Kona's homage to Kauai. Passionfruit, orange and guava balance the subtle bitterness of the aromatics of the Azacca and Galaxy hops. Perfectly sessionable.

Hole 14 - Kona Longboard (Kailua-Kona, Hawaii)

Longboard is a smooth refreshing lager fermented and aged for weeks at cold temperatures to yield its exceptionally smooth flavor. A delicate, slightly spicy hop aroma complements the malty body of this beer.

Hole 15 - Kona Big Wave (Kailua-Kona, Hawaii)

Kona wanted to make a beer that went down easy after a day out on the Links. This is just the ticket. Big Wave is a lighter bodied golden ale with a tropical hop aroma and flavor - a smooth, easy drinking refreshing ale. The use of caramel malt contributes to the golden hue of this beer and their special blend of hops provides bright quenching finish.

Hole 16 - Tiny Rebel "Cwtch" (Newport, Wales)

Probably the best word ever. Cwtch (rhymes with butch) can mean either cuddle or cubbyhole. Grab a glass, relax and cwtch up with this untraditional Welsh red ale - a perfect blend of six caramelly malts and three citrussy American hops. Champion beer of Britain 2015.

Hole 17 - Tiny Rebel "FUBAR" (Newport, Wales)

The flagship pale ale and a firm favourite. Classic American hops give an edge to edge to this traditional style British beer. A huge relief from the boring brown stuff that has filled Britain's pint glasses for far too long.

Hole 18 - Asahi Super Dry (Tokyo, Japan)

With its refreshing barley flavour and crisp aftertaste, Asahi Super Dry is by far the most popular export from Japan follwed closely by Hideki Matsuyama.
